On March 22nd I had the honor to represent you and the students of Haverhill at the State House, as the chairs of the Joint Committee on Education call the #PromiseAct hearing to order. I met with our Representative Vargas and was present to witness the testimony or our mayor Fiorentini. I was present as the Promise Act took home prizes for star power (Patriots players!), content (three times more state funding than Governor Baker's bill), and narrative (compelling stories told by students, parents and educators about how inadequate funding hurts kids). Educational funding is the number one issue facing the state and Haverhill. The MTA and the HEA are leading the movement to increase state funding in Haverhill by 14 million dollars. Together our collective voices will be heard.

KNOW YOUR WEINGARTEN RIGHTS

You have the right to union representation during investigatory interviews.

According to the Supreme Court in NLRB v. J. Weingarten, Inc.

- 1. The employee must make a clear request for union representation before OR during the interview. The employee cannot be punished for making this request.
- 2. After the employee makes the request, the employer must choose from among three options:
 - a. Grant the request and <u>delay the questioning</u> until the union representative arrives and has a chance to consult privately with the employee; OR
 - b. Deny the request and end the interview immediately; OR
 - c. Give the employee a choice between having the interview without representation (you should never choose this option!) or ending the interview.
- 3. If the employer denies the request for union representation and continues to ask questions, it commits an <u>unfair labor practice</u> and <u>the employee has a right to refuse to answer. The employer may not discipline the employee for such a refusal.</u>

When being interviewed by administration, if you feel the discussion could in anyway lead to disciplinary action invoke your Weingarten Rights by saying, "If this discussion could in anyway lead to my being disciplined or terminated, or affect my personal working conditions, I respectfully request that my union representative, officer, or steward be present at this meeting.

Clip and keep this Weingarten Rights handy - you never know when you might need it!
